What is the CULIP Program?

Curtin School of Education, in partnership with Lesmurdie Senior High School, offers a unique internship opportunity to Secondary Pre-Service teachers who are completing their teaching qualifications.

As part of the CULIP Program, Pre-Service teachers will be immersed in all aspects of teaching by attending Lesmurdie SHS throughout the year. They will be under the guidance of experienced and supportive mentor teachers and administrators.

Pre-Service teachers who participate in this internship gain confidence through hands on experience and regard themselves as more classroom ready. Principals are keen to employ graduates, especially those who can attain and sustain proven practice over an extended time in a secondary setting.

Why should I apply?

- CULIP provides in depth understanding of how the classroom, teaching and learning environment and whole school planning interrelate to the Pre-Service teacher's own practice and pedagogy
- Offers opportunities for extensive professional learning experiences and develops collegiate networks
- Pre-Service teachers are able to participate in ongoing whole school and Learning Area feedback and improvement cycles using the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers.

How do I join the CULIP Program?


1. Attend the information day at Lesmurdie SHS on Friday 29 November at 10am
